

**To apply for reinstatement from resignation in good standing,
when resigned for less than 2 years,**

Rule 32(c)(12)(C) Ariz. R. Sup. Ct. applies when Applicant has been Resigned in Good Standing less than 2 years;

Reinstatement of resigned persons shall be governed by the procedures set forth in Rule 64(f) Ariz. R. Sup. Ct. and shall require:

- i. Payment of fees, assessments, and administrative costs, the resigned person would have been required to pay;
- ii. proof of completion of any hours of continuing legal education activity the resigned person would have been required to take, had the applicant remained a member; and
- iii. proof that the resigned person possesses the character and fitness to resume practicing law in this jurisdiction.

CALCULATION OF BACK DUES AND FEES: It is incumbent upon Applicant to contact the State Bar of Arizona's Membership Department to inquire the total back dues and fees due when applying under Rule 64(f)(1). The e-mail is: membership@staff.azbar.org. Please indicate if Applicant will be reinstating to active or inactive/retired status.

MCLE: For MCLE status, requirements and MCLE fees, contact the MCLE Department, at: MCLE@staff.azbar.org. Include any other jurisdictions Applicant has been actively practicing in during the suspension. Please indicate if Applicant will be reinstating to active or inactive/retired status.

Back dues and fees must be paid prior to reinstatement. There is not a mandated application form or template to apply.

Upon verification of compliance, the board shall enter a letter of reinstatement.

The resignation will remain until an order is entered by the court reinstating the Applicant to the active practice of law.
