Pursuant to ACJA § 7-209(E), the Committee on Alternative Business Structures, upon completion of its review of the application of Summit National Law Group, LLC, for licensure as an Alternative Business Structure, voted on December 9, 2025, to recommend that this Court grant licensure. The Committee’s recommendation to grant licensure was transmitted to this Court for review under Rules of the Supreme Court of Arizona, Rule 33.1(a).

The Committee was to take into consideration the regulatory objectives specified in Rule 33.1(b)(1) and ACJA § 7-209. The objectives must be considered in light of the Court’s jurisdiction given that licensure is sought in Arizona. *See* Rule 31(a). Thus, licensure must be served to benefit persons or entities located in Arizona. Based on its representations to the Committee, the intended focus of the applicant would be on securing investment capital to support the delivery of legal services. While some Arizona residents may be involved in these cases, that would occur incidentally through marketing responses rather than as fulfilling the applicant’s intended objective.

Therefore, this Court having reviewed the Committee’s recommendation and considered the representations as to the intended focus of the applicant,

IT IS ORDERED denying the initial application of Summit National Law Group, LLC, as an Alternative Business Structure in Arizona without prejudice to the submission of an amended application for consideration by the Committee on Alternative Business Structures. Any amended application should reflect how licensure will advance one of the objectives listed in Rule 33.1(b)(1) and ACJA § 7-209 as it relates to persons or entities located in Arizona.
