In 2024, the State Bar of Arizona opposed SCR1022, which would have asked the voters to decide whether to give the Arizona legislature oversight of the practice of law in Arizona, which is excluded under the direct interest exception rule - Treasury Regulation 1.162-20(c)(2)(ii)(b).
