I. On a separate sheet, please provide the following information:

- A. Record of Discipline. A discipline check will be conducted on every applicant. Please list any disciplinary actions taken against you in any state, jurisdiction, or organization since your last date of certification. In addition, list all instances of discipline in which the sanction imposed was censure or greater, or an informal reprimand in which the disciplinary record was public, pursuant to Rule 70, Ariz. R. S. Ct. A record of discipline or failure to disclose the same may constitute grounds for denial of an application.
- **B.** Employment History. In chronological order, beginning with your most recent employment, list a complete statement of your employment during the past five years. Include the dates of employment, employer's name and address, and a brief summary of the nature of the work performed.
- **C. References.** List the names, mailing addresses <u>and</u> e-mail addresses of five attorneys who practice in workers' compensation and/or judges before whom you have appeared, familiar with your practice, and not including current partners or associates. You may not use as references the members of the Board of Legal Specialization or the Workers' Compensation Advisory Commission. A list of the members serving in these capacities can be found at:

In addition to the references you provide, the Workers' Compensation Advisory Commission will also contact other individuals with respect to your qualifications, and public comment will be sought through a State Bar publication. All references will be requested to provide written comments regarding your knowledge, skill, thoroughness, preparation, effectiveness and judgment in workers' compensation as well as your ethics and professionalism. Statements of references shall be confidential and privileged from disclosure, except to the applicant upon request.

The Standards for Certification require that an applicant demonstrate a high degree of honesty, integrity and professionalism and meet <u>high</u> ethical standards in compliance with, and as defined by, the Lawyer's Creed of Professionalism of the State Bar of Arizona as well as the Rules of Professional Responsibility. These standards are higher than the bare minimum ethical and professionalism standards an attorney must meet to avoid disciplinary action or the threshold conduct that would warrant the filing of a bar complaint.

In addition to information about ethics and professionalism, references will be asked to assess your competency as a Workers' Compensation practitioner. The required degree of competence is substantially higher than that possessed by a general practitioner who regularly handles a workers' compensation matter. For purposes hereof, a "high degree of competence" shall meet the following standards:

- 1. That the applicant demonstrates a substantially complete knowledge of substantive law and rules of practice, procedure, evidence and ethics pertaining to workers' compensation law; and
- 2. That the applicant demonstrates a high degree of skill, thoroughness, preparation, effectiveness, professionalism, and judgment in the field of workers' compensation law;
- 3. Legal competence to be measured by the extent to which an attorney (1) is specifically knowledgeable about workers' compensation law, (2) performs the techniques of such practice with skill, (3) manages such practice efficiently, (4) identifies issues beyond his or her competence relevant to the matter undertaken, bringing these to the client's attention, and (5) properly prepares and carries through the matter undertaken.

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D. Substantial Involvement in Workers' Compensation Law. Pursuant to the Standards for Certification of Lawyers Specializing in Workers' Compensation, applicants must demonstrate substantial involvement in the field of workers' compensation law during four of the preceding five years, including the year immediately preceding this application.

For purposes hereof, "substantial involvement in the field of workers' compensation law" shall mean that at the time of making application hereunder, an applicant meets the following standard:

Employment equivalent of at least 40% of a full-time practice, defined as an average of at least 16 hours per week, to matters where the primary issue involved is a person's entitlement to benefits under the Arizona Workers' Compensation Act. Service as an attorney, whether in a private or governmental capacity shall qualify, as well as service as an Administrative Law Judge for the Industrial Commission of Arizona, if the minimum time standards referenced herein, are met.

An applicant may fulfill the requirement of "substantial involvement in the field of workers' compensation law" by complying with the preceding standard during four of the preceding five years, including the year immediately preceding his or her application. Evidence of such compliance shall be indicated by attaching fifteen (15) Decisions of cases litigated to a conclusion within the application period. Cases that have been resolved by settlement after at least one hearing, will be considered; however, the preference will be for trials.

An applicant may demonstrate substantial involvement in the field of workers' compensation law by furnishing the BLS with information regarding the nature of the legal services in which the applicant has been engaged and identifying the types of issues of workers' compensation law with which the applicant has dealt and the frequency of his or her involvement therewith. Such demonstration shall be made initially through completion by the applicant of the specialization application, but written or oral supplementation may be required.

E. Continuing Legal Education. Provide information regarding CLE you acquired with advanced level programming, concentrated in workers' compensation issues, consisting of 12 Hours of substantive CLE activities in workers' compensation law and 3 hours in professional responsibility, and per BLS Rules, VIII. (B).
